The interior is a tastefully renovated jumble of open fires, original Victorian stained-glass windows and plush armchairs, perfect for escaping sleet and showers. On sunny days, the terrace, with its sweeping views over a valley straddling the Kent-Sussex border, is the place to be. There's no coasting on the location when it comes to Sunday lunch, though. Hogget, Sussex beef or Creedy Carver chicken come with duck-fat roasties, red cabbage and seasonal greens. Fight off post-roast sleepiness with a stroll in the grounds below. The Beacon is set in 17 acres, with three lakes.
